Dear Bill:

I have not yet received the questions you were intending to submit to me relative to Chapter 49, Session Laws of 1933.

I have examined this law, and I am of the opinion that county and school district warrants may be issued in paying 75% of any debt or demand, including taxes, due to the subdivision which issued the warrant. I have heretofore rendered my opinion that neither State nor county warrants may be received in payment of State taxes.
