Dear Sir:

The Attorney General has received your letter of March 28th in which you have requested his opinion as to whether or not, under the provisions of Section 37 of Chapter 82, Session Laws of 1931, each quarter of each half pound of butter must carry the name and weight on the individual wrapper. You have stated in your letter that you have found a number of cases where plain wrappers are used, with the label being only on the carton.

It is the opinion of the Attorney General that, pursuant to the provisions of Section 37, Chapter 82, supra, each quarter or each half pound of butter does not have to carry the name and weight on the individual wrapper when the same is sold from the original container in the presence of the purchaser. If, however, a quarter or half pound of butter is not taken from a container which is properly marked and stamped, as provided by law, in the presence of the purchaser, then the wrapper must be stamped in the manner provided by law.

This opinion is in accordance with the oral discussion which we had upon this subject some time ago.
