Dear Mr. Kerby:

In reply to your submission as follows:

"When certifying to the various Boards of Supervisors in each of the fourteen counties, to the various names of candidates who have complied with the Primary Election Laws, and whose names will appear on the Primary Ballot, will it be necessary to include the Democratic, Republican, Socialist, Communist, Non-Partisan, Independent, etc., parties, and will it be necessary for the various Boards of Supervisors to provide ballots for all of the enumerated parties above where the registration shows registered voters of the various parties designated."

The Secretary of State shall certify to the various Boards of Supervisors for a position on the Primary Election ballot those political organizations (1) which at the last preceding General Election shall have cast five per cent of the total vote in the state for its candidates, and (2) those organizations created by a petition signed by qualified electors of the state equal to at least two per cent of the votes cast for Governor at the last preceding General Election in at least each of five counties of the state.
