Gentlemen:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of November 17th, in which you seek an opinion of the Attorney General as to whether an apprentice barber or cosmetician may be compelled, after serving an apprenticeship, to take an examination and obtain a journeyman's license or may such an apprentice continue to practice as an apprentice indefinitely.

Please be advised that the law does not limit the time during which an apprentice may serve as such. If an apprentice has served for a period of two years, as required by law, and chooses to continue working as an apprentice the board cannot legally object.
