Gentlemen:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of recent date in reference to your school.

School trustees may provide transportation for any child or children when they deem it for the best interests of the district. (Subsection 6, Section 1011, R.C.A. 1928). Any expense in this behalf must be paid from district funds. All school districts receive the state and county apportionment, and in addition thereto have such moneys as are raised by special district levy.

One and two room schools receive a lump sum apportionment. This apportionment may be used by the trustees as they see fit. Moneys can be expended from this fund for transportation.

Section 1038 authorizes the County School Superintendent, by and with the consent of the Board of Supervisors, to expend not to exceed \$10.00 per month per pupil of compulsory school age in the matter of transportation or creating an accomodation school, etc. In this respect the County School Superintendent cannot be compelled to make the expenditure, nor can the County School Superintendent make the expenditures without first having the consent of the Board of Supervisors.
