Dear Madam:

We have your letter of September 22d, requesting an opinion concerning the use of the automobile purchased by your board. You state that the inspector refuses to use this car for traveling in connection with her official duties, but desires to use her private car.

Please be advised that we find no provision in our laws where your board is required to furnish the inspector with a car for traveling in connection with her official duties. However, since the board has a car, it is entirely within its discretion as to whether it should require said inspector to use the car owned by the board or allow said inspector mileage and expenses incurred by her in the operation of her private car when on business of the board.

We are unable to advise as to whether or not you should sell the car belonging to the board and what procedure you should take in selling it in view of the fact that the law does not require you to purchase such car.
