Dear Sir:

We have your request of this date for an opinion as to your legal right to give a permit to the Social Security & Welfare Board to use and occupy the mining exhibits building at the Fair Grounds.

In view of the fact that the Social Security & Welfare Board of the State of Arizona is a State agency and the Fair Grounds is the property of the state, we know of no legal objection to the Fair Commission giving the Social Security & Welfare Board a permit to temporarily use one of the buildings on the Fair Grounds for office purposes, providing the use of the building by the Board does not interfere with the business of the Fair Commission in holding a fair on the Fair Grounds.

Section 4 of Chapter 73 of the Laws of 1935 would authorize you to grant the Board the permit mentioned in your request. However by Section 2918, the Board of Directors of State Institutions is given some control over the State Fair and we suggest as a matter of precaution that you have the Board of Directors of State Institutions approve the granting of the permit.
