Dear Dr. Marlar:

I have your letter of recent date in which you request an opinion as to whether or not a naturopath may sign renewal medical certificates for the purpose of examining barbers and others as required under our laws.

Under sections of our law where an examination is necessary for the renewal of a certificate, I find that in all instances the term medical certificate is used.

This has been understood as being a certificate of a medical man of general scientific attainments of the profession of medicine.

It is the opinion of this office that in those sections of our law which require a medical certificate that such a certificate may only be issued by a person holding a valid license to practice medicine and surgery.
