Gentlemen:

I have your letter of May 18 requesting an opinion from the Attorney General upon the following matter:

"If a man took the Arizona State Board examination in Optometry and failed to pass in all the subjects would it be necessary for him to take the entire examination again or could it be left to the discretion of the board to examine him again in the subjects in which he failed to pass?"

"Could the Board require this man to pay another examination fee of \$25.00?"

In answer to your first question, it is the opinion of this office that where an applicant took the examination in optometry and failed to pass in all the subjects and did not make a grade of at least seventy-five per cent in each subject, it would be necessary for such applicant to take the entire examination again.

In answer to your second question, it is the opinion of this office that the examination fee of \$25.00 must be paid to your Board each time an applicant takes the examination.
