Gentlemen:

We have your letter of September 16th stating that the Medical Board at the last regular meeting ruled that the Chicago Medical School no longer met the requirements of the standards set forth by the Association of American Medical Colleges, and that its graduates henceforth would not be acceptable for examination and reciprocity in this State.

You further state that there is a graduate of said school who took the examination before the adoption of that ruling but who failed to pass the examination. You desire to know whether the ruling would have the effect of prohibiting said applicant from taking the examination. It is our opinion that your ruling is not retroactive in its nature and that it only affects those graduates from said school after the date of the adoption of the ruling by the Board.
