Dear Sir:

We have your letter of December 9th relative to the status of the janitor at the Young school.

We are enclosing herewith a copy of an opinion rendered to your County Attorney which we believe will answer the first portion of your request.

Replying to the remaining questions of your letter, it is our opinion that there is nothing in the law to prohibit the Justice of the Peace from holding office if he is a member of the Board of Trustees, provided he is in all other respects qualified.

You further state that one of your school trustee's daughter's father-in-law is a teacher in your school, and desire to know if it is legal for him to draw his pay under this board, and can he be re-elected under same. Our answer to that question is yes for the reason that the person referred to is not related to the trustee by either consanguinity or affinity as those terms are understood in the law.
