Dear Sir:

We have your letter of January 22d in which you state:

"Please define the kind of bond necessary to fill the law required under Section 76-125, 1939 Code, weigh-masters bond."

The statute does not prescribe the kind or form of bond a public weigh-master is required to execute. Therefore it is our opinion that it is discretionary with your Department as to whether he should execute a surety bond or bond executed by individuals. In the event the weigh-master executes a bond signed by individuals, it would be necessary for the weigh-master and two sureties to sign the bond. If the sureties are married then it would be necessary for the wives of the sureties to join in the bond.
