Dear Mr. Walker:

We have your letter of June 11th, in which you state:

"I would appreciate you advising me at your earliest convenience, if, under the law passed by the recent legislature, the Warden has the authority to allow 2 to 1 in the yard, as outlined in said act."

Chapter 45, Laws of the Regular Session, 1941, amended Section 47-109, Arizona Code Annotated, 1939, so as to allow double time to prisoners holding positions of confidence and trust within the prison walls.

Subdivision (b) of said act vests you with the discretion of allowing double time to prisoners for each day they hold a position of confidence or trust, either within or without the prison walls, provided of course you must exercise your discretion within one year after said act takes effect, namely, June 16, 1941.
