Dear Dr. Trueblood:

In your letter of December 11, 1950, and our telephone conversation of December 14, 1950, you stated that the Board has received a request to furnish information from certain examination papers; that said request was made by attorneys for the examinees; that said request was more than 90 days after the examination represented by such papers. You request our opinion as to your duty and power to furnish the information requested.

The Board is required to hold such papers open for inspection by examinees for 90 days after the examination. After such period, however, such papers may be destroyed (Section 67-919 ACA 1939). Obviously then, if such papers have been properly destroyed, you have no power or duty, either as a practical matter or provided by law, to furnish such information.

Assuming, however, that the Board has not destroyed such papers, we are of the opinion that, after the 90 day period, the said Board may legally either furnish or refuse to furnish such information to an examinee or his duly authorized attorney upon mere request.
