Dear Sir:

In reference to the matter which we discussed today in my office, on the prosecution of parties employing aliens on State, County or Municipal works, it is my opinion that, as the law now exists, these prosecutions are not proper and do not apply on projects involving the expenditure of Federal funds. I would recommend that Section 1352, as it reads in Chapter 85, Session Laws of 1929, be amended by the present Legislature to strike out the proviso exempting such employment on Federal Aid projects, provided that the Federal Government will not take issue with this amendment and remove Federal Aid.
