Dear Mr. Duncan:

Referring to your letter dated February 9, 1953, in which you request an opinion concerning the expiration of the statutory period after posting of a license application, Section 21-326, A. C. A. 1939, is quoted for your information:

"21-326. Computation of time.---In computing any period of time prescribed or allowed by these rules, by order of court or by any applicable statute, the day of the act, event, or default after which the designated period of time begins to run is not to be included. The last day of the period so computed is to be included, unless it is a Sunday or a legal holiday, in which event the period runs until the end of the next day which is neither a Sunday nor a holiday. When the period of time prescribed or allowed is less than seven (7) days, intermediate Sundays and holidays shall be excluded in the computation. A half holiday shall be considered as other days and not as a holiday."

By virtue of the section quoted, when the twentieth day after the posting of an application falls upon either a legal holiday or upon a Sunday, the twenty day period shall not run until the end of the next day which is neither a Sunday nor a holiday.
