My dear Mr. Flynn:

I enclose copy of a letter from Mrs. Sarah G. Garcia, 610 Centzen Avenue, Tucson, Arizona. You will note from her letter that she states one Jacob Kame, Jr., has been interned as an alien Japanese.

According to her letter, this boy's father was a Japanese merchant and his mother, an American citizen of Mexican extraction. She states that he has a brother now in the United States army and that this boy never associated with the Japanese, does not speak their language and is, to all practical purposes and intent, an American citizen. She further states that his services are greatly needed by his widowed mother in the conduct of their store.

If these circumstances are as related, then it appears to me this is a case in which the release of the boy to his mother would be justified. May I ask that you have this case checked into by the proper authorities, with a view to returning the boy to his mother, if the circumstances warrant the same?

I would be very glad after you have concluded this investigation, if you would advise me of your findings and action in the matter.
