

AGRICULTURE LABOR RELATIONS BOARD

FRIDAY, AUGUST 25, 1972
GOVERNOR'S CONFERENCE ROOM, CAPITOL BUILDING

The initial organization meeting of the Agriculture Labor Relations Board was called to order at 10:00 a.m. Friday, August 25, 1972, by Milton G. Sanders, Acting Chairman.

Members present were Gene Blake, William S. Boice, John L. Consaul, Jack E. McManus, Jack M. Montgomery, Milton G. Sanders, Jesse A. Udall, and R. Keith Walden.

John McGowan and Jim Bond of the Attorney General's office were also in attendance.

It was determined that each member had signed and filed his Oath of Office as required by law.

At 10:10 a.m., Governor Jack Williams was introduced and spoke briefly of his appreciation to the members of the Board for accepting their appointments. The Governor expressed his hope that the Board would consider their basic duty as being fair to farm labor, fair to farm labor employers and, above all, fair to the public which depends on the products of the agriculture industry.

Mr. McGowan and Mr. Bond discussed House Bill No. 2134 with particular reference to powers and duties of the Board. Then followed discussion and questions by various Board members.

By unanimous consent, the Board elected Milton G. Sanders as Chairman of the Board and Jesse A. Udall as Vice Chairman.

Discussion was held regarding the selection of an Executive Secretary. Chairman Sanders, Jack E. McManus and Gene Blake were instructed to screen candidates for the job and present them to the Board at its next meeting.

The Board selected the fourth Wednesday of each month as the date of future meetings.

At 11:45 a.m., the meeting was adjourned.
