

Dear Arizona Librarian:

We are pleased to announce the release of the first program in a new slide series on the PREHISTORIC SOUTHWEST, titled "Early Peoples." This 80 slide/cassette program for Intermediate-Senior High features the Clovis, Folsom and Cochise Cultures.

This program will enable the student to identify the animals which roamed the Southwest during the last Ice Age and the people who hunted them. When the climate changed and the grasslands became deserts, these giant mammals disappeared. Man could no longer live by hunting alone; his way of life began to evolve.

Archaeological "digs" in Arizona and New Mexico have been milestones in discovering the progress of man in America. This story is told via location photography, museum dioramas, artifacts and drawings to form a comprehensive, authoritative learning package.

"The Hohokam" script is being written by Gene K. Garrison, newspaperwoman, author and educational filmstrip writer and photographer. Production will commence in March; this program will be ready for shipment on May 25.

These programs are designed and produced by Sandra J. Benjamin, educational media specialist and formerly Coordinator of Instructional Materials with the Roosevelt School District #66, Phoenix, Arizona.

Ms. Benjamin says, "Some filmstrip programs have a small segment about the prehistoric peoples of the Southwest, but this material usually concentrates on the Anasazi of the Four Corners area without delving in the other early cultures in Arizona and New Mexico. After trying to fill teacher requests for Arizona audio-visual materials and not succeeding to any great extent, I decided to produce curriculum-oriented programs myself."

SCHOOL LIBRARY SURVEY

Results of the Spring, 1977 school library survey conducted by the School Libraries Division of ASLA have been tabulated for the 136 high schools as follows:

1. Does your school have a library?
135 answered "yes"; 1 answered "no". (The Cysis School for Special Education in PUHSD with 192 students).
2. Is the library used for library purposes only? (As opposed to being used as a study hall or classroom for part of the day)
106 answered "yes"; 26 answered "no"; 4 did not respond.
3. Is your school library ever used as a study hall during the day?
23 answered "yes"; 111 answered "no"; 4 did not respond.
4. Is there a certified librarian in your school?
126 answered "yes"; 9 answered "no"; 1 did not respond.
There are 1,029 high school students who are not served by certified librarians; enrollments in these schools range from 42 to 193.
5. What percentage of librarian's work day is devoted to library and/or audiovisual responsibilities?
106 - 100% 2 - did not respond
4 - 84% 9 - did not have librarians
1 - 75%
3 - 70%
9 - 50%
1 - 25%
1 - 10%
6. How many clerks do you have in your school library?
Of the schools with certified librarians, 19 did not have any clerical assistance. One school with 2,961 enrollment had no clerks, but 4 librarians. Enrollments in schools without clerical assistance ranged from 191 to 1,127.
7. What is the approximate number of volumes housed in your library?
5 did not respond. The total number of volumes housed in high school libraries is approximately 1,761,509. The largest collection was 57,000.

8. Are AV materials housed in your library?
122 answered "yes"; 13 answered "no"; 1 did not respond.
9. Are AV materials housed in the classroom?
85 answered "yes"; 49 answered "no"; 2 did not respond.
10. Are AV materials housed in both places?
78 answered "yes"; 57 answered "no"; 1 did not respond.
11. Is the librarian responsible for any equipment?
102 answered "yes"; 31 answered "no"; 3 did not respond.
12. What term do you use as the official name of your center?
79 - Library; 19 - Media Center; 19 - IMC;
3 - Resource Center; 2 - Learning Resource Center;
1 - Library Resource Center; 1 - LRC; 1 - Instructional Center;
1 - Does not have a center; 10 - Did not respond.
