PHOENIX THE CAPITOL CITY OF ARIZONA. THE BUSY BUSINESS CITY OF THE NEW STATE

Heart of the Great Salt River Valley, centrally situated in an area of 240,000 acres of the finest agricultural land in the world. The land is irrigated from the Roosevelt Dam, the World's Model Irrigation System.

The census of the population in Phoenix shows over 15,000 people with an additional 5,000 in the suburbs immediately adjacent. There are 20,000 people who are supplied with mail from the Phoenix postoffice and by the five rural routes which are supplied from the city.

Phoenix is a modern city. It has its own water works, the supply being pumped from deep wells. The pumping capacity of the plant is 7,000,000 gallons daily and the water is of good quality. Splendid banking facilities are afforded in the city and all the Banks are housed in fine quarters. A modern fireproof hotel with 174 rooms opened on November 1st. The approximate cost of this hotel was \$300,000. There are several other hotels, all of which have been modernized and improved and are well equipped.

The city has paved streets in the business section and has installed a splendid lighting system for main thoroughfares. A sewer system to cost \$400,000 is now under way and a new Federal Building to cost \$172,000 is in the course of construction.

In commercial buildings the city has taken a big stride. During the past year approximately \$1,000,000 worth of business buildings have been erected or are rapidly approaching completion. Evidence of the advancement that the place is making was shown this year when the new \$100,000 concrete bridge, the longest bridge of its kind in the world, was opened to the public. Another evidence of the good growth of the city is the Y. M. C. A., which occupies a building of its own costing over \$100,000. This building would grace a city four times the size of Phoenix and occupies a square, together with the Water Users Building

and the Federal Building. The Water Users Association have their own office building, erected at a cost of \$40,000 and the Woman's Club Building, formally opened in November, cost \$15,000. The City Hall and Court House each occupy a block on the main street and the grounds are parked. The Public Library is also situated in one of the small parks. There are fine churches of all denominations. School advantages are of the best. A \$75,000 grammar school has just opened and a \$200,000 high school, as well as many other new school buildings, will soon be ready. There are seven other grammar schools already in use, together with primary schools, kindergartens, high school and business colleges.

As Capitol City, Phoenix is headquarters for many fraternal organizations and secret societies and for all State officials. The Capitol building at Phoenix is a fine example of architecture of the southern type and is built of native stone, tufa and granite. The park surrounding the Capitol building is one of the most beautiful spots in the Southwest and is a splendid example of the wonderful growth that is possible on the lands of the valley.

From Phoenix are easily reached the great Ostrich Farms, one of which is the largest outside of South Africa, the orange and olive groves and date orchards. The improvement of highways being pushed forward and the building of good, broad roads along the banks of the main canals make very delightful trips possible.

The surrounding towns of Mesa, Tempe and Glendale are easily reached by road or by rail. An interurban electric line connects Glendale with Phoenix and plans are in hand for lines to connect with Tempe and Mesa.

The altitude of Phoenix is 1076 feet above sea level. The average temperature for the spring season is 67.3 degrees; in the summer season the average reaches 87.9 degrees; in the autumn the average is 70.1 degrees; in winter 52.1 degrees, or an average for the entire year of 69.4 degrees. Clear sun shiny days are usual. During a period of forty years the average number of clear days each year has reached 232, with partly cloudy days 96, cloudy days 37, and the same number of rainy days; of foggy days there were only two each year. During the same period of years the average annual rain-fall was 8.08 inches.

Phoenix is lighted by electricity generated at the Roosevelt Dam, and the street railway is also operated by the same power, which can be had at reasonable rates for industrial purposes. There are two telephone systems in Phoenix which connect with points throughout the valley and Arizona. Long distance lines to Pacific Coast points are also in operation.

Phoenix has about 400 licensed automobiles, probably a larger number per capita than most cities.

The great area of the Salt River Valley is tributary to Phoenix and the growth and future prosperity of the city is assured by the immense possibilities of this body of 240,000 acres of agricultural land. Markets for the produce of the Valley are found in the mining camps in Arizona and much is shipped throughout the country in large consignments. The Valley is becoming famous for its cantaloupes, oranges, dates, olives, figs, lemons, grape fruit, peaches, pears and apricots; grains, cereals, sugar beets, alfalfa seed and hay; dairying is very profitable and the raising of fine horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, bees and ostriches are among the opportunities that are money makers.

Entering the Valley there are two railroad systems, with branches radiating to the South. Pac. main line at Maricopa; to the Santa Fe main line at Ash Fork, to Los Angeles by way of Parker, into the Gila Valley mining section to the eastward, and into the Buckeye Valley westward. This Gila Valley Buckeye stretch of the Southern Pacific will soon be connected up at Yuma and San Carlos into a main line for the road through Arizona, with the lowest gradients of any transcontinental line. The El Paso and Southwestern Railroad system has surveyed a line to Phoenix from Benson through Tucson, and will start work this year, bringing also the traffic of the Port Lobos road, a Santa Fe line to tide-water on the Gulf of California.

It is a beautiful valley, resplendent under the unhindered sun with great fields and orchards, set in a frame of friendly mountains, red, brown, purple and parti-colored in their coverings.


