

EXECUTIVE ORDER 92-34

TASK FORCE FOR DEVELOPMENT OF GOVERNOR'S
AWARD FOR QUALITY

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona desires to instill, promote and recognize the concepts, principles and practices of Total Quality Management; and

WHEREAS, the State does not have a process, program or instrument to recognize public, private or other types of organizations for their adoption, practice and promotion of Total Quality Management concepts, principles and practices;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Fife Symington, Governor of the State of Arizona, hereby establish a Task Force for the development of criteria for a Governor's Award For Quality. The Task Force shall consist of the following members:

The Task Force's efforts shall be coordinated with the Governor's Advisory Council On Quality. The criteria for the Governor's Award For Quality shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

1. The award will be presented annually with the first award to be made in October 1994.
2. All Arizona organizations, public/private, profit/non-profit, are eligible.
3. The administration and organization of the award program shall be defined by the Task Force.
4. An independent body of examiners shall be established comprised of examiners, senior examiners, and judges who are considered experts in Total Quality Management concepts, principles and practices.

The Task Force shall present a report containing its final recommendations to the Governor on or before April 30, 1993.


This Executive Order shall expire July 1, 1993.
