

EXECUTIVE ORDER 93-9

POSTPONEMENT OF IMPLEMENTATION OF TITLE XIX
IMPLEMENTATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES


WHEREAS, the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System has statutory authority under Laws 1992, Chapter 301, Section 42, to implement Title XIX Mental Health Services by February 1, 1993, or, upon an executive order issued by the Governor not later than July 1, 1993, for persons who are sixty-five years of age or older and are eligible for the Arizona Long Term Care System pursuant to A.R.S. 36-2931; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System pursuant to Laws 1992, Chapter 301, Section 42, has taken all necessary steps to insure that mental health services are delivered in accordance with federal and state law to eligible persons; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System Administration, in consideration of issues related to funding those mental health services, has determined that the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System and the Arizona Long Term Care program contractors will need until July 1, 1993, to finalize contracts and complete operational and system changes;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Fife Symington, Governor of the State of Arizona, under authority provided by A.R.S. 36-2939, and after consultation with the Joint Legislative Council Committee for the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System, hereby authorize a delay of the implementation of mental health services pursuant to this section by establishing an implementation date which is July 1, 1993.


