

CREATING THE GOVERNOR'S GRAND CANYON AIRPORT COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the State is committed to protecting the business climate and tourist industry of Northern Arizona; and

WHEREAS, the State must anticipate the growth in international and national tourists to Northern Arizona; and

WHEREAS, this growth will create greater demand on the transportation facilities serving this part of the state; and

WHEREAS, the Grand Canyon Airport, operated by the Arizona Department of Transportation Aeronautics Division, has been the subject of an organizational analysis conducted by the Governor's Office For Excellence,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Fife Symington, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and by the statutes of this State, do hereby create the Governor's Grand Canyon Airport Commission and order and direct that:

1. The Commission be comprised of the following:
 - the Director of the AZ Department of Transportation, who shall serve as Chairman
 - a representative of the Governor's Office
 - the Superintendent of Grand Canyon Park
 - a representative of the AZ Department of Commerce
 - a representative of the AZ Department of Tourism
 - a member of the Coconino County Board of Supervisors
 - a representative of the Grand Canyon Trust
 - one member from the Chambers of Commerce of either Flagstaff or Williams
2. The Commission shall consider the question of whether the State should continue to manage the Grand Canyon Airport, review the issues presented in the report prepared by the Governor's Office For Excellence, consider the options presented, and make recommendations to the Governor within a reasonable period of time.
3. The Commission shall meet at the call of the Chairman and at such place within the state as the Chairman may designate
4. This Order shall become effective immediately
