EXECUTIVE ORDER

No. 84-1

RELATING TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF STATEWIDE PLANS, PROGRAMS AND PROCEDURES DIRECTED AGAINST THE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES BY INTOXICATED PERSONS

WHEREAS, the safety of persons and property in the State of Arizona continues to be threatened by intoxicated drivers of motor vehicles; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the State of Arizona to protect the safety of persons and property within the State through the enforcement of laws and the development of programs designed to abate the dangers posed by the intoxicated driver; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that specific functions and responsibilities be assigned to certain State agencies to abate the danger posed by the intoxicated driver; and

WHEREAS, in order that the most effective use be made of all resources that are available or may be made available to combat the intoxicated driver, it is necessary that all appropriate and/or related programs and plans at the State level be coordinated with those related activities of the State's political subdivisions, the federal government and agencies of the private sector;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bruce Babbitt, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and Laws of this State, it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. My Highway Safety Representative and the Office of Highway Safety which he directs, are responsible for the development of a State Plan to curtail driving of intoxicated persons in Arizona and the submission thereof to me for promulgation.

Further, the Highway Safety Representative is hereby designated as the State Coordinating Officer for the implementation of such plan.

2. The head of each department, bureau, board, commission and independent institution in State government, hereinafter referred to as agency, is responsible for the intoxicated driver activities assigned to the respective agency and shall designate a responsible staff position within the agency to function as the agency coordinator for intoxicated driver activities to include the development of plans covering those activities.

3. The State Alcohol and Driving Plan shall delineate specific assignments of functions to State agencies cognizant of similarities between such assignments and routine functions and responsibilities.
