

EXECUTIVE ORDER

No. 84 - 3

RECEIPT OF CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION
MARICOPA COUNTY JUVENILE COURT CENTER

WHEREAS, the Maricopa County Juvenile Court Center is responsible under Section 8-105, Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.), to conduct or cause to be conducted an investigation of prospective adoptive parents or foster parents to determine if they are fit and proper persons to adopt children; and


WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety maintains a Criminal Identification Section pursuant to A.R.S. 41-1750 for the purpose of procuring and maintaining information concerning arrests and convictions of persons for public offenses in Arizona; and

WHEREAS, the Maricopa County Juvenile Court is procuring this information for juveniles who are not involved in the criminal justice process but who are orphaned or declared incorrigible, and is considered a noncriminal justice licensing agency of the State; and

WHEREAS, noncriminal justice agencies of the State may receive criminal history information from the Department of Public Safety Criminal Identification Section pursuant to A.R.S. 41-1750 (G) only by specific authority granted to that agency by statutes, ordinance or Executive order, and subject to rules and regulations of the Department of Public Safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bruce Babbitt, Governor of the State of Arizona, under authority provided by A.R.S. 41-1750 (G), do hereby authorize the Criminal Identification Section of the Department of Public Safety to provide and the Maricopa County Juvenile Court to receive criminal history record information for the purpose of investigating prospective adoptive parents and prospective foster parents in accordance with those rules and regulations issued by the Department of Public Safety.


