EXECUTIVE ORDER

69-8

RELATING TO THE DESIGNATION OF  
THE COOPERATIVE AREA MANPOWER PLANNING SYSTEM

WHEREAS, Interagency Cooperative Issuance Number 1 of March 3, 1967, of the Cooperative Area Manpower Planning System, issued jointly by participating federal agencies: Department of Labor; Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; Department of Housing and Urban Development; Office of Economic Opportunity; and the Economic Development Administration of the Department of Commerce, established guidelines for the membership and functions of State and area manpower coordinating (CAMPS) committees;

WHEREAS, Cooperative Area Manpower Planning System Interagency Cooperative Issuance (ICI) Number 69-1 of January 19, 1968, further describes the functions of the State and area manpower coordinating (CAMPS) committees; and encourages the Governor to assume whatever leadership he deems appropriate in the activities of and to designate the Chairman or a representative to the State Manpower Coordinating (CAMPS) Committee;

WHEREAS, Executive Order 11422, signed by the President of the United States, on August 15, 1968, established cooperative planning and execution of manpower service programs as the policy of the Federal Government;

WHEREAS, it is the expressed desire and intent of the President of the United States that responsibility for the planning, coordination, and administration of all federally-funded manpower programs shall require early and intense commitment of selected heads of State Government;

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intent of the Governor of Arizona and of the federal agencies participating in CAMPS to insure that the people of Arizona through representation in three major sectors: employee, employer, and the general public, participate in the formulation of all federally- and State-funded manpower programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jack Williams, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby order and direct that:

The Cooperative Area Manpower Planning System (CAMPS) is recognized as the system responsible to the manpower requirements of the people of Arizona and is designated as the system in Arizona through which all manpower programs of agencies within the State will be implemented;

The Arizona Manpower Coordinating (CAMPS) Committee (hereinafter referred to as the State CAMPS Committee), as established, is designated as the body to coordinate all federally- or State-funded manpower program activities of agencies in Arizona and to develop and implement a statewide cooperative manpower plan;

All agencies within the State developing manpower programs are hereby directed to present their program proposals to the State CAMPS Committee for approval and inclusion in the Annual State Cooperative Manpower Plan, or as an amendment to the plan, and must receive approval of said proposals by the State CAMPS Committee prior to the submission or presentation of said proposals to any funding agency;

The Chairman of the State CAMPS Committee shall be the Director of Manpower Planning for the State of Arizona;

The Chairman of the State CAMPS Committee shall have the responsibility to establish appropriate subcommittees as necessary for the said State Committee's operation.

The membership of the State CAMPS Committee shall be expanded to include at least one representative from each of the following sectors: employee, employer, and the general public. Said representatives shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Governor's Human Resources Advisory Council and selected from the membership of said advisory council.

With the approval of the Secretary of Labor, area CAMPS Advisory Committees will be formed within each planning region designated by the Governor's Executive Order No. 69-6 of October 28, 1969. Membership of these area Advisory Committees will be selected by a committee comprised of the mayors and the county boards of supervisors within each region. Additional Advisory Committees may be formed if deemed advisable by the Governor's Human Resources Advisory Council. Area Advisory Committees will consist of nine members, of which three members shall represent employees, three shall represent employers, and three shall represent the general public. Said area Advisory Committees shall also serve as those Advisory Committees as set forth in Section 205 (b) of the Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962, as amended.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Arizona.
