EXECUTIVE ORDER  
72-3

PURSUANT TO Chapter 192 of the Laws of 1972, Second Regular Session of the 30th Arizona Legislature (Senate Bill 1288), and by virtue of my authority as Chief Executive Officer of the State of Arizona;

I, JACK WILLIAMS, Governor of the State of Arizona, do declare that the State Commission now known as the CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION of Arizona shall, pursuant to legislative directive, now be known as the ARIZONA CIVIL RIGHTS ADVISORY BOARD, and that there is established in the office of the Department of Law a division to be called the CIVIL RIGHTS DIVISION.

The transfer of responsibility, the change of name and all other changes contained in Sections 9, 19 and 21 through 28 of Chapter 192 shall become operative on the 1st day of January, 1973.

This Order is issued pursuant to Section 31 of Chapter 192 and makes operative all of the provisions set forth in Paragraph B of said Section 31 applicable to the Civil Rights Division, which reads as follows:

B. The provisions of Sections 9, 19 and 21 through 28 of this act shall become effective at such time as the Governor by Executive Order declares that the civil rights division within the department of law shall become operative, but in no event later than July 1, 1973.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Arizona.

DONE at the Capitol in Phoenix this 21st day of December in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-two and of the Independence of the United States the One Hundred and Ninety-seventh.
