

EXECUTIVE ORDER

73 - 5

RELATING TO THE INTRODUCTION AND IMPLEMENTATION
IN STATE GOVERNMENT OF CERTAIN MEASURES FOR THE
CONSERVATION OF ENERGY

WHEREAS, there is in Arizona, as throughout the United States, an increasing serious shortage of energy necessary to maintain the economy of the nation and to sustain the standard of living to which Americans are accustomed; and

WHEREAS, it is apparent that certain actions must be imposed without delay to conserve the energy supplies that we have and to distribute them for the maximum benefit of the greatest number of our citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jack Williams, Governor of Arizona, do hereby order and direct:

1. That all state-owned motor vehicles not be driven at speeds in excess of 50 miles per hour, except in emergency situations.
2. That heads of state agencies and departments impress on their employes the necessity of obeying the 50-mile-per-hour limit to conserve gasoline and also to set an example for all citizens.
3. That heads of state departments and agencies impose controls to make certain that the use of state cars is limited to essential business.
4. That heads of state agencies and departments be on the alert for means of reducing the use of electricity by at least 10 per cent.

The cooperation of every employe of the State of Arizona is urgently solicited to carry out the objective of conserving energy.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Arizona.
