E X E C U T I V E   O R D E R

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Continuing the Arizona State

Fuel and Energy Office

WHEREAS, the threat of critical fuel and energy shortages continues to exist in the United States of America, and in particular in the State of Arizona; and

WHEREAS, these fuel and energy shortages, if uncontrolled, will threaten the continued full operation of vital business enterprises, industries, services, and utilities in the State of Arizona and thereby the full and productive employment of many Arizona people, and may further threaten the health and well-being of the State of Arizona and its political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, these fuel and energy shortages, if uncontrolled, may threaten individuals in terms of personal transportation and the proper operation of their homes; and

WHEREAS, the Administrator of the Federal Energy Office has published and will publish regulations which will require the participation of the State of Arizona in federal programs to provide equitable allocation and distribution of fuel and energy supplies which will be made available within our state; and

WHEREAS, I have determined that the state of emergency proclaimed the seventh day of January, 1974, continues to exist;

NOW, THEREFORE I, Raul H. Castro, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby order and direct:


1. The operation of the Arizona State Fuel and Energy Office shall be continued.
2. The composition, staffing and operation of this office will be as directed by the Governor, or his duly assigned designate.
3. The overall mission shall be to manage the fuel and energy resources for the state in accordance with the policies established by the Governor/Legislative Leadership Energy Task Force, and directives issued by the Governor.
4. The functions and purpose shall be to:
  - a. Allocate fuel and energy supplies available to Arizona to ensure:
    - (1) Essential public services.
    - (2) Protection of individual householders.
    - (3) Production, processing and transportation of essential agricultural products.
    - (4) Minimize unemployment.
    - (5) Avoid undue hardships.

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- b. Develop fuel and energy conservation programs.
  - c. Review and if necessary conduct research on fuel and energy availabilities and their impact on social and economic factors.
  - d. Review and if necessary conduct research on alternate and new sources of energy.
  - e. Implement the regulations to be published, and already published, by the Administrator of the Federal Energy Office as they may apply to the State of Arizona.
  - f. Provide the staff work for the functioning of the Governor/Legislative Leadership Energy Task Force.
5. This order shall become effective immediately, and will continue until terminated by the Governor, but not beyond January 30, 1976.
