

EXECUTIVE ORDER
NO. 90-13

G.V. 1.3-193/90-13

* GOVERNOR'S HAZARDOUS WASTE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE *

WHEREAS, the protection of the public health and the environment is of first priority to the State of Arizona; and

WHEREAS, the public has expressed strong concern for the potential for adverse impacts from the treatment and disposal of hazardous waste; and

WHEREAS, hazardous wastes and hazardous materials are transported into, out of, and through Arizona; and

WHEREAS, facilities for the treatment or disposal are not available in Arizona for hazardous wastes generated in Arizona; and

WHEREAS, an examination of options for treatment and disposal of hazardous wastes is appropriate; and

WHEREAS, Arizona should embrace a State policy of hazardous waste minimization and source reduction; and

WHEREAS, the science and knowledge of hazardous waste treatment and disposal are advancing rapidly;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rose Mofford, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, do hereby create the Governor's Hazardous Waste Advisory Committee and order and direct that:

1. The Advisory Committee shall:
 - o Review the current science and technology for treatment and disposal of the types of hazardous wastes generated in Arizona and identify those which might be appropriate for future use in Arizona.
 - o Identify and review new sciences and technology which have the potential for treating and disposing of hazardous wastes; especially those with the potential for reducing the risks to the public health and environment in Arizona.
 - o Review hazardous waste minimization and source reduction programs used in other political jurisdictions and identify those which might be appropriate for Arizona.
 - o Review the relationship between hazardous waste disposal and treatment needs, general economic development, and protection of the public health and environment, and recommend the appropriate relationship between these parameters.
 - o Review the Hazardous Waste Disposal site authorized by Article 1 of Chapter 5 of A.R.S. Title 49, consider the information and recommendations identified in fulfilling the other charges of this Executive Order, and develop recommendations on the appropriate role, scope, science, and technology for this State site.
2. Members of the Advisory Committee shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor, and shall serve without compensation. The Governor shall designate the chairperson, and the Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the chairperson.

3. Membership of the Advisory Committee shall be well versed in technical and scientific aspects of hazardous waste management and shall include representatives of the following groups:
 - a. Geologist/Hydrologist
 - b. Department of Emergency Response & Military Affairs
 - c. Hazardous Waste Engineer at large
 - d. Representatives from two Public/Environmental Interest Groups
 - e. State University Representative
 - f. Health Care Industry
 - g. Toxicologist
 - h. Hazardous Waste Producer
 - i. Air Pollution Control Expert
 - j. Department of Environmental Quality
 - k. Hazardous Waste Transportation Industry
 - l. Hazardous Waste Treatment and Disposal Industry
 - m. Representatives of Political Subdivisions
 - n. Agriculture
4. The Advisory Committee shall issue its final report by October 1, 1990.
