

EXECUTIVE ORDER  
NO. 90-19

ESTABLISHING THE STUDY COMMISSION ON CANCER  
IN PROFESSIONAL FIRE FIGHTERS

WHEREAS, the Study Commission on Cancer in Professional Fire Fighters was established through the Second Regular Session of the Thirty-Eighth Legislature; and

WHEREAS, this five-member Commission was established to examine the cancer rates and type of cancer among professional fire fighters in this State; and

WHEREAS, the Study Commission's statutory authority terminates on September 1, 1990, and an interim report will be submitted to the Office of the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rose Mofford, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby establish the Study Commission on Cancer in Professional Fire Fighters to examine the cancer rates and types of cancer among professional fire fighters in this State:

- 1) The Study Commission will be a five-member commission consisting of experts in cancer research or statistical analysis.
- 2) The members of the Commission shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and without compensation.
- 3) The Commission shall:
  - a) Study current and former fire fighters who are or were members of the Public Safety Retirement System to determine their rates of acquiring cancer, types of cancer acquired, cancer death rates, and ages at which they died from cancer.
  - b) Develop a written report containing its findings.
  - c) Submit its written report to the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House prior to March 1, 1991.
