EXECUTIVE ORDER

NO. 90-24

ARIZONA LEADERSHIP ADVISORY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the participation of quality leaders in the governance and leadership of the State of Arizona is essential; and

WHEREAS, maintaining and promoting the involvement and participation of qualified individuals is necessary; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to examine methods for supporting, maintaining, and strengthening the development of leadership statewide; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arizona, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate recognize that the involvement of a broad spectrum of citizens from throughout our State is essential to the progress of our State;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Rose Mofford, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, hereby create the Arizona Leadership Advisory Council and order and direct:

- 1) The Council shall:
 - a. Develop specific recommendations for both statutory and constitutional changes, if necessary, to encourage the continued participation and cultivate new participation in leadership positions within Arizona; and
 - b. Identify, analyze, and recommend methods for maintaining and promoting participation in State government, including, but not limited to:
 - o Process for establishing the compensation of elected officials;
 - o Length of State legislative sessions;
 - o Terms of office;
 - o Financial disclosure by candidates;
 - o Campaign financing; and
 - o Ethics and conflict of interest

- 2) The Council shall be composed of 36 members representing all geographic areas of Arizona. The Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate shall each appoint 12 members, no more than six of whom shall be from any one political party or from any one county. Members shall serve without compensation and may be replaced at the pleasure of the appointing officers.
- 3) The Governor shall designate a chairperson or persons from among the membership of the Council. The Chairperson may create sub-committees and appoint sub-committee chairpersons as deemed necessary.
- 4) The Council shall meet at the call of the Chairperson;
- 5) The Council shall report its interim findings and recommendations to the Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate no later than July 1, 1991, and shall submit a final report no later than November 15, 1991.
- 6) The Council shall expire on January 1, 1992.
