



EDUCATION OF INDIAN CHILDREN IN 1978

Indian children attend public, Federal, private and mission schools. In fiscal year 1978 there were 41,324 Indian students, age 5 to 18 years, inclusive, enrolled in Federal schools in the United States.

For more than three centuries Indian education in the United States was largely under the direction of missionaries. As early as 1568, the Jesuit Fathers organized a school at Havana, Cuba, for Indian children from Florida. This was the first school attended by Indian children who lived within the United States.

Many of the treaties between the United States and Indian tribes provided for the establishment of schools for Indian children. Congress has also provided schools for Indian children where other educational facilities were not available. In 1842, there were 37 Indian schools in operation and by 1881 the number had increased to 106. In 1978, the Bureau of Indian Affairs operated 173 schools with an enrollment of 41,324 Indian children and 15 dormitories for 2,151 children attending public schools.

The primary objective of Federal schools operated for Indian children living on Indian-owned or restricted trust lands is to prepare them for successful living. In Federal schools, children develop basic academic skills, acquire an understanding of the social and economic world which surrounds them, learn improved standards of living, follow practices which assure optimum health, acquire the necessary vocational training to qualify for gainful employment, and obtain sufficient education to enter special schools, and institutions of higher learning. The system of schools provided by the Federal Government for Indian children meets program standards required by P.L. 95-561, Title XI, the Indian Education Act, November 1, 1978.

A full 4-year high school course was offered at nineteen schools. Sixteen other schools offered high school training at less than the 4-year course.

Indian children are entitled to the same opportunities for public school education as are provided for other citizens living within a State. Over one-third are educated at no cost to the Bureau of Indian Affairs. In some States, however, tax-exempt, Indian-owned lands and large numbers of Indian children within a school district may create financial burdens for which local funds are inadequate. As early as 1890, contracts providing for financial assistance to schools attended by Indian children were negotiated with individual districts. It was recognized then, that Indian children become better adjusted to living with all people in a community when they

associate with other children in public schools. Today, P. L. 95-561 emphasizes a full range of choices for Indian Tribes and parents. The Johnson-O'Malley Act, which became law in 1934, authorized the Secretary of the Interior to enter into contracts with States for the education of Indian children and to permit the use of Federal school buildings and equipment by local school authorities. Consequently, some States with large Indian populations now have no Federal schools within their boundaries.

Under the terms of Public Law 874, 81st Cong. (64 Stat. 1101), as amended August 13, 1958, administered by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, a new Federal aid resource was made available to eligible school districts educating Indian children. This aid is available to meet partial costs of normal school operation. Additional supplemental aid for the education of Indian children under the Johnson-O'Malley program is limited to districts that do not qualify under the Public Law 874 program and to districts meeting educational problems under the extraordinary circumstances, including special services and special programs designed to facilitate the education of Indian children.

In fiscal year 1978, the Bureau of Indian Affairs entered into contracts with 6 States, 92 school districts in other States, and with 146 tribal groups in accordance with approved plans which specify conditions under which financial aid is extended. In addition to these, aid is provided through contracts for the education in public schools of 2,151 out-of-district Indian children living in dormitories operated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

In summary, the Bureau of Indian Affairs had direct responsibility for the 43,475 children enrolled in Federal schools and housed in Federal dormitories, and partial financial responsibility for two-thirds of those enrolled in public schools.

Congressional appropriations to the Bureau of Indian Affairs are limited to the education of children of one-fourth or more degree of Indian blood and native children in Alaska, except for the Cherokee Agency where children of less than one-quarter degree of Indian blood enrolled in the tribe may attend Federal schools. Native children in Alaska are Indian, Eskimo and Aleut. The following tables relate to Indians and native children as defined above, and to their schools

Table 1. indicates numbers of schools by area.

Table 2. indicates enrollment and average daily membership (ADM) in Federal schools by type of school and area. Average daily membership for all schools was 92.3 percent in 1978 as compared to 89.3 percent in 1977. ADM may be higher than total enrollment. Enrollment reflects the enrollment of a student into the BIA school system, while ADM indicates the daily membership of the particular schools. When a student changes schools, the student is shown as "enrolled" at the original school but the membership is recorded at the new school.

In fiscal year 1978, the Bureau of Indian Affairs operated kindergarten classes in 108 schools (40 boarding schools and 68 day schools) with an enrollment of 3,112 children. All kindergarten pupils attend school on a day basis. The kindergarten enrollment represented 7.5 percent of the total enrollment.

Table 3. lists boarding schools operated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, mailing address, enrollment, average daily membership and grades taught.

Table 6. indicates grade level. In 1978 enrollment in kindergarten and first four grades decreased 238 pupils to 16,966 as compared to the previous year's 17,204. This group represented 41.1 percent of the entire student body.

In line with the Bureau's policy of encouraging public school enrollment of Indian children, many students transfer to public schools when they reach the sixth grade and have acquired some facility in the use of the English language. This is a factor in the seemingly low numbers of graduates of Federal high schools. In

fiscal year 1978, 1513 high school students graduated, a decrease of 101 students from 1977.

Table 7. indicates the number of high school graduates and the number of Post High completions or placements.

Table 8. indicates students according to their degree of Indian blood. Full bloods comprise 72.6 percent of the total and only 9 percent are less than one-half Indian blood.

Table 9. shows tribal designations of students in Federal schools. One hundred and thirty-six specific tribes or tribal groups, Aleuts, Eskimos, and the various tribes of Indians in Alaska were represented in 1978

Sixty-Eight tribes had fewer than 39 members each and these are grouped together as "All Other Tribes." Aleuts, Eskimos, Navajos, Sioux, Chippewas, and Pueblos (including Hopi, shown separately) are the most numerous and together comprise 71 percent of the total enrollment.

Table 10. indicates the completed school construction, both new and replacement, during fiscal year 1978.

Table 11. indicates the extent of the activities carried out under Title I. In fiscal year 1978, the Bureau of Indian Affairs participated for the eleventh year in the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.

Table 12. indicates the number of undergraduate and graduate students who received scholarship grants in fiscal year 1978, also the number of students earning degrees.

Table 13. shows the number of students enrolled in schools by States receiving assistance through contracts funded under the Johnson-O'Malley Act which became law in 1934.

Table 14. shows the number of Indian pupils enrolled in schools being operated under contract to Indian groups.
