SCHEDULE FOR CASSETTE DUPLICATION AND TAPE PLAYER CHECK-OUT...Students enrolled in courses using audio materials are to bring their cassette tapes (good quality, usually 90 minutes) to the Library Circulation Desk where they will be given a label on which to write their name and the title of the tape to be copied.
