**SCHEDULE FOR CASSETTE DUPLICATION AND TAPE PLAYER CHECK-OUT...** Students enrolled in courses using audio materials are to bring their cassette tapes (good quality, usually 90 minutes) to the Library Circulation Desk where they will be given a label on which to write their name and the title of the tape to be copied. The tape is to be left in the tray on the Circulation counter (tape cases should not be left). Tapes in before 5 p.m. can be picked up the next day at the desk. *Instructors requesting this service for their students should inform the Media Dept. which tapes will be required and put on reserve.* Tape players may also be checked out at the Circulation Desk; students must show their college I.D. and leave name, Soc. Security Number, class, and the instructor's name on the check-out card. Players may be checked out for three days e.g., those checked out on Monday are due back Wednesday, those checked out on Thursday are due Monday. The fine for overdues is 25¢ per day.

**INDIAN POTTERY EXHIBIT...** Be sure to see this remarkable exhibit generously loaned to the Instructional Materials Center (Library) by Mr. Lee Hutchings, one of Mr. Lundeen's ceramics students, who has been collecting for over twenty years. Featured are Salado pottery and artifacts from the Tonto basin area in Arizona (spanning a period from 900 A.D. to 1400 A.D.), Nayarit figures from a culture centered around Tepic near Guadalajara, and Pre-Columbian artifacts. Of particular note are two very rare hair ornaments, bone awls, and arrow shaft straighteners from Arizona. DON'T MISS THIS FINE DISPLAY!

Students entering such programs would usually have completed two years at the Community College and then would need two more years of N.A.U. coursework offered in the Valley. Thus it is possible in some majors to earn a degree without going to the Flagstaff campus. If you wish further details about these programs or any other information stop and see Mrs. King between the hours of 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on one of the following days: Tuesday, October 12th, Monday, November 29th, or Monday, December 16th.




