IMC CIRCULATING ART PRINT COLLECTION

Fifty-eight reproductions of famous paintings, framed and ready for hanging, are on open circulation in the Library and are available to all students. Selection can be made September 4th through 7th from the Art Print Photo Album at the Circulation Desk. The prints are circulated on a first-come first-served basis. To make the prints available to as many as possible, there is a limit of one print per person. All prints are due back December 14, 1979. Borrowers assume full responsibility for liability in the event of loss or damage; however, there is no rental fee.

Schedule for Cassette Duplication and Tape Player Check-Out:

A student enrolled in a course using audio materials is to bring his cassette tape (90-minute TDK Highlander, Memorex or Scotch only) to the Library Circulation Desk where he/she will be given a label on which to write his/her name, date, instructor's name, lesson and tape number to be copied (tape cases should not be left). Tapes require 24 hours for duplication. No more than three tapes at one time will be accepted.

Tape players may also be checked out at the Circulation Desk; a student must show his college identification and driver's license and sign his name and social security number on the check-out card. Players may be checked out for three days (e.g., those checked out on Monday are due back Wednesday, those checked out on Thursday are due Monday). The fine for overdues is 25¢ per day.



STUDENT FINANCIAL AID: Public Law 94-482 contains a provision whereby each Student Financial Aid (SFA) recipient is required to maintain "Normal Progress". This means there is an established relationship between the level of SFA received (awarded) and the number of credit hours completed. That relationship has been defined by MCCC SFA Officers as follows:

<u>Funding Level</u>	<u>Credit Hours Required</u>
100% of need	12 or more hours
75% of need	9 - 11 hours
50% of need	6 - 8 hours

Students who fail to achieve "Normal Progress" will no longer be eligible for SFA until the deficiency is removed. If the student feels that his/her circumstances are unique, he/she may submit a "Petition of Waiver of Normal Progress" to the SFA Office. If the denial is sustained, the student may appeal to the GCC Standards and Admissions Committee.

Schedule for cassette duplication and tape player check-out:

A student enrolled in a course using audio materials is to bring his cassette tape (90-minute TDK Highlander, Memorex or Scotch only) to the Library Circulation Desk where he will be given a label on which to write his name and the title of the tape to be copied (tape cases should not be left). Tapes require 24 hours for duplication.

Tape players may also be checked out at the Circulation Desk; a student must show his college identification and leave his name and social security number on the check-out card.
