The Phoenix Symphony Chamber Orchestra opens the 1984-1985 CEAS Artists' Series of Glendale Community College at 8p.m. Friday, September 21 in the GCC Performing Arts Theater.

The Orchestra, featuring guest conductor and violinist Franco Gulli, will present works by Antonio Vivaldi.

Gulli, one of the worlds finest violinists, has made appearances with every principal orchestra and festival of Europe, the Soviet Union and the United States.

He has performed in solo recital and with his wife, pianist Enrica Cavallo, for more than 30 years throughout North and South America.

Gulli is Professor of Music at Indiana Universities' School of Music and has taught at the Academia Chigiana in Siena, Italy and the Conservatory of Music in Lucern, Switzerland.

The all Vivaldi concert includes Concerto for Two Violins and Orchestra, No. 8 in A Minor, Op.3; Concerto for Violin and Orchestra in E Major, "Amaroso"; and the Four Seasons for violin and String Orchestra, Op. 8.
