Dear friends of Lehi Ward:

All of my memories of Lehi Ward are near and dear to me since Lehi was home ward for the first twenty-five years of my life; then again in later years at which time I served in the Relief Society Presidency. It was during these later years that I learned to appreciate woman's place in Church and of the love and devotion the women of the Lehi Ward have for service to their fellow ward members and the Priesthood. Florabel Taylor and Priscilla Shill are two such women, and were my ever-faithful counselors. Without them my term as President would have fallen short in many respects. I am sure.

I recall one service the women in the ward gave to the Bishopric which I feel was outstanding. Bishop Earl Merrill seemed pretty discouraged in trying to make plans for raising \$350.00 which was Lehi's assignment for the Welfare Project. Florabel, Priscilla and I called all the women in the ward for a meeting one afternoon without disclosing the purpose of the meeting. We told them of the assignment and explained as best we could the financial situation of the ward and asked for volunteers to canvas the ward for this Welfare assignment. Within a week the funds had been collected from the women of the ward-----mostly from women of the Ward-----and at a joint Priesthood-Relief Society meeting held at night the \$350.00 was presented to Bishop Merrill. He had heard nothing of the campaign and seemed very pleasantly surprised. When told how it had been accomplished he protested that his family had not been asked for a donation, but Sister Louie in her usual but firm way informed him that they certainly had not been left out. May the Lord bless Relief Society women the world over.

We are sorry to report the passing away of Brother W. Earl Merrill, one of Arizona's most distinguished citizens. He was historian, author, artist and columnist among his many talents.

We have been honored to print many of Brother Merrill's stories in the MESSENGER and we know that many readers have enjoyed these glimpses into Arizona's past.

Brother Merrill had served as vice-president of the Mesa Historical Society, and a member of the society's bi-centennial committee.

He was assistnat Stake Clerk in the North Mesa Stake.

He was named Mesa artist of the Year and recieved the Service to Mankind Award both this year.

He has written "One Hundred red Echoes from Mesa's Past," "One Hundred Yesterday's and "One Hundred Steps Down Mesa's Past." He also wrote a weekly historical column for the Mesa Tribune.

Brother Merrill had taught from 1926 to 1942 and worked for the U.S. Postal service until 1947. He recieved a degree in education at A.S.U. in 1934 and a master's degree from the University of Arizona in 1941.

He is survived by his wife, Louise; children, Melva L. Hall, Earlene Dewey, Vonda Marie Gross and David E. Merrill as well as four brothers; two sisters; and sixteen grandchildren.

extend our sincere sympathy to the Merrill family. We realize that this is a great loss to the community and the state also, when talents such as Brother Merrill possessed are lost to us.

Love prompted young couple to remain at Mormons' camp

The Mormon settlement on the Salt River was divided and most of the families were moving away, but this didn't stand in the way of love and marriage.

Indeed, it may have helped Mary Ellen Merrill, 18, make up her mind that she did want to marry Dan P. Jones, 20.

Her father was Dudley J. Merrill, nephew of Philemon C. Merrill, who was the leader of the families leaving the camp on Aug. 27, 1877.

Jones' father was Daniel W. Jones, who had led the Latter-day Saints to Salt River from St. George, Utah, and whose friendliness to the Indians was resented by many of the others.

Dan P. Jones had fallen in love with Mary Merrill during the wagon journey from Utah.

Years later, Jones recalled that he and Mary "would loiter behind many times and not get into camp till after camp was made. My father used to say I was like the old cow's tail—always behind, but I didn't care, as I was deeply in love by this time."

On March 1, 1877, the wagons passed through Wickenburg. That night, camped on the desert, Jones asked Mary to marry him.

"She did not say 'Yes,' but kissed me so I took that for 'Yes,'" he said.

The Mormons arrived on Salt River March 6 and immediately went to work digging an irrigation ditch, but the need for supplies led some of the younger men to take jobs elsewhere.

JONES SPENT JUNE and July working in a grain threshing crew in the Phoenix area. While he was gone, the dispute between his father and the anti-Indian faction broke out and the decision to split the camp was reached.

Young Jones learned of the troubles when he returned to the camp about the first of August.

"As Mary's father, Dudley Merrill, was leaving, the question of whether she

would go with him or remain with me was difficult for her to decide," Jones wrote. "We had not intended to get married for some time so that I could get a start in the world. Her father was willing for her to marry me so she decided to remain with me..

"We were married the day before her father left. It was the 26th of August, which happened to be my father's birthday. We were married in the fort that

we had built in the center of section two near where the bridge crosses the canal at the Lehi school house."

HE RECALLED THAT Mary "had a nice white dress to be married in, but I had nothing but heavy winter clothes and it was the 26th day of August and in Salt River Valley. I had a new pair of boots, good pants, and white shirt. Brother Biggs loaned me a nice linen coat so we looked pretty well, so they said.

"We had a big dinner cooked by my mother. The main dish was roasted venison. A sheep man coming over the hills from Fort McDowell had killed two or three deer, so he gave most of the meat to us for the wedding feast."

Additional details of the wedding are found in "Pioneer Women of Arizona," compiled and edited by Roberta Clayton Flake of Mesa:

"The wedding dress was of fine white material, and was more valuable because it was earned through hard work by Mary Ellen herself, and then when the first baby was expected, the wedding dress was cut up, made into dainty little clothes, lovingly trimmed with lace she crocheted.

"BUT TO GO BACK to the wedding, all the townspeople were there. The ceremony was performed by the groom's father, at whose home it was held. The mother had made plenty of molasses cake, cooked potatoes and fried a venison that had been provided for the great occasion.

"Everyone had a good time until someone thought it would be quite a lark to put the newlyweds to bed. The girls caught the bride and were preparing to disrobe her and the boys were going to do the same for the young husband, but he had other ideas.

"The only light for the occasion was twisted rags burning in a dish of tallow. One of the boys was holding one of these, 'just to throw a little light on the subject,' when Dan up with his foot and kicked the dish out of the fellow's hand, extinguishing the light and scattering

the hot grease around, and the party broke up."

The next day, the Merrills and their partisans departed, and Dan and Mary Jones set up housekeeping.

"WE GOT A LARGE tent and pitched it inside the fort," Jones said. "We had a bedstead which I had made out of mesquite and corded with rope. For a time our table was a clothes chest which I had brought from Utah. The women had given us enough dishes to keep house for us two. We were as happy as if we had thousands."

Mrs. Flake's account said the "furniture consisted of a trunk Mary Ellen had, and Dan's pine chest. These were placed on rocks to make them high enough for a table. The bedstead was made of mesquite, corded back and forth with a strong rope. A woman in Phoenix had let her have enough ticking to make a bed. This was stuffed with grass she gathered. Her stepmother gave her two pillows made from her own mother's father's bed."

Their wedding presents "consisted of tin cups, four tin plates and two knives and forks."

COOKING WAS OVER a campfire, until "a large army stove was purchased and fixed up in the center of the fort and everyone cooked on it," Mrs. Flake wrote.

"Mary Ellen's Christmas present from her husband that first Christmas was a set of six earthen plates, and was she proud!

"When the first baby was large enough to play on the floor, Mary Ellen could not put him on the bare ground so she made a carpet of gunny sacks and tufted it underneath with straw."

Eleven more babies were born to the Joneses.

In later years, Jones served four terms as a member of the Arizona House of Representatives, including the first legislature after statehood. He was speaker of the House during the meeting of the sixth legislature in 1923.
