





Walk through Arizona's past as you wander the hallowed halls of the Arizona Capitol Museum. The Arizona Capitol, constructed during territorial times 1899-1901, is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. This historic site served as both territorial and state capitol.

On a visit here you can "meet" a wax figure of Arizona's first governor, George W.P. Hunt . . . imagine yourself at the Constitutional Convention as you sit at a desk in the House of Representatives chamber. Write your own bill in a "Tale of Two Chambers" and take it on an interactive journey into law – if you're able! See the USS Arizona model in the rotunda and spend a moment remembering the lives lost at Pearl Harbor. Examine the artwork adorning the walls of the Capitol . . . and finally, shop for that perfect Arizona gift in the Museum store.
