



*** What is the difference between open and closed captioning?**

Open captions are just like the subtitles of a foreign film. It can be shown on any television set or movie theatre.

Closed captioning becomes visible only when enabled by an internal decoder or when the television is connected to a TeleCaption Decoder or some other external device.

*** What is Rear Window Captioning?**

Rear Window Captioning is inverted captioning shown from the rear and read through the reflection of a plexiglass plate positioned in a cup holder or held up by a stand.

*** How do I know which theaters offer Rear Window Captioning or open captioned movies?**

You can find information through the National Center for Accessible Media for the theater closest to your home. See contact information given below.

*** How can I get a movie theater nearby to my home to offer Rear Window Captioning or open captioned movies?**

You will need to write a letter to the theater headquarters requesting accessibility. Use the contact information given below to contact the National Center for Accessible Media to find out more.

*** How can I get an upcoming film to be released at theaters or on videotape to be captioned?**

You will need to write letter to the studio producing the film. Use the contact information given below to contact the National Center for Accessible Media to find out more.
