

# Stewart Udall

IS DOING A GREAT JOB IN CONGRESS

## FOR ARIZONA

... he was active in the successful fight to establish the town site of the Glen Canyon Dam project on the Arizona side of the Colorado River.

... he introduced legislation making possible the establishment of the Kitt Peak National Astronomical Observatory on Papago Indian Land.

... he helped pass legislation which will relieve serious water-logging problems for farmers in the Yuma area.

... he was author of the bill which upgraded the Petrified Forest National Monument to national park status.

... he originated the independence plan for full development of Colorado River Indian lands which is now being prepared for presentation to Congress.

... he co-sponsored legislation to resolve the 85-year-old Navajo-Hopi boundary dispute.

... he developed the last-minute strategy which won enactment of the Anderson-Udall bill providing \$20 million for new roads to open the Navajo and Hopi Reservations to full development.

## FOR THE NATION

... he supported the Small Business Investment Act to encourage local groups to raise capital to help businesses in their own communities.

... he voted tax relief for small business.

... he supported a strong Civil Rights Bill in the House, anticipating compromise Senate amendments which would rule out filibuster. This strategy resulted in the first Civil Rights law in 82 years.


... he served on the committee which framed and led debate on Alaska Statehood Bill.

... he is credited as one of two congressmen most responsible for bringing the Kennedy-Ives labor reform bill to a vote in the House.

... he helped draft the National Defense Education Act of 1958.

... he won national notice for exposing abuses in the Soil Bank Program (\$209,000 to one farmer) which resulted in a tightening of the administration of this program.

... he co-sponsored legislation prohibiting unnecessary withdrawal of public lands by military services.

Representing *all* the people of Arizona, Stewart Udall has crossed party lines consistently to vote for the Benson-Eisenhower farm price support program.
