






THE INDIAN HOT SPRINGS, Eden, Arizona are located in the Safford Valley, Graham County, Arizona, eighteen miles west of Safford, three miles north of U. S. National Route No. 180, connecting El Paso, Globe and Phoenix.

The Springs are accessible by auto roads as shown on map and also by Southern Pacific R. R., Globe Branch, disembarking at Pima, where motor transportation (10 miles) is available.

There are four large springs and many smaller ones within 100 yards of the hotel, each with different chemical ingredients. The total daily flow from all springs is in excess of 1,500,000 gallons, the uniform temperature being 118 degrees Fahr.

The use of the water externally, as hot baths, or mud baths is particularly efficacious in cases of arthritis, neuritis, sciatica, rheumatism and disorders of stomach, kidney and liver.

ACCOMODATIONS


A brick building with 30 double rooms, steam heated, toilets on each floor, spacious lobby and card room, large porches, dining room and four Roman baths in the building, contains all necessary conveniences for comfortable treatment. The kitchen is under the supervision of an expert chef. Milk and cream from our own dairy herd. The baths are under the direction of a competent nurse.

Outside the main building are cottages for tourists; a bath house with three separate Roman baths without attendants; a mud bath, all baths directly connected to water at 118 degrees Fahr. For those not desiring or needing the hot baths, a swimming pool 210x70, through which the water constantly flows from the main spring, provides fresh water at a temperature around 100 degrees at the shallow end (3ft.) cooled to temperature of air at the deep end (10ft.).

RECREATION

Riding horses are available and the 360 acres of land surrounding the springs afford ample exercising ground, and the adjoining roads for miles are gravel surface.

The swimming pool is the largest in the Southwest, is concrete lined, fresh water constantly flowing, cleaned thoroughly every week, and provided with spring board, diving tower and dressing rooms.

Croquet, horse-shoe pitching, hand-ball and miniature golf, illuminated at night are now available. A concrete tennis court and nine hole golf course will be ready for use early in 1931.

AUTO TRIPS


The drives by auto are over excellent roads, U. S. Highways No. 180 and 80. The management will gladly supply guides and all information as to points of interest, some which are here shown.

HUNTING AND FISHING

Mt. Graham, 20 miles south, is 10,516 feet above sea level, and in season provides excellent deer hunting, while quail and doves in abundance are nearer at hand.

METEOROLOGICAL DATA

Located at an elevation of 2800 feet in the foothills, the springs are available for occupancy all the year round.

BEAUTY SPRING--500,000 GALS. DAILY

One of many large and small springs, pouring forth highly medicinal mineral water, at a temperature of 118 degrees Fahrenheit. The total daily flow is in excess of 1,500,000 gallons.

Piped to Hotel, Baths and Pool.

CONTENTS OF WATER

The water from all springs is soft and pleasant. As analysed by the University of Arizona, the contents are shown as 3500 parts per 1,000,000 of Sodium, Magnesium in the form of Chlorides, Sulphates and Bicarbonates with no injurious substances.
