
# TONOPAH HOT MINERAL WELLS

## A DESERT RETREAT

Tonopah Hot Mineral Wells is a popular year 'round guest ranch and resort on the warm Arizona desert, 50 miles west of Phoenix, where people come from all over the country to renew their health or to relax and play in the sun beneath a blue and cloudless sky.

In the heart of America's largest dude ranch area, this inviting oasis in the shadow of the purple hills offers unexcelled opportunities for outdoor life during the winter months, when springlike weather prevails. Here in the peace and calm of the lovely Saguaro valley, where the spirit of the Old West still lingers, guests can enjoy the quiet and serenity of the brooding desert without sacrificing the conveniences and advantages of modern living.

Accommodations at this desert retreat are of a high class, but not ostentatious. The main lodge is a modern stucco building with a large comfortable lobby, a bright, cheerful dining room and a clean, inviting kitchen. All rooms are attractively furnished with a view to the comfort of guests and each has a private toilet.

## THE TONOPAH WATER

The pure, health giving water at Tonopah Hot Mineral Wells comes from the earth at a temperature of 116 degrees fahrenheit and possess unusual therapeutic values. It is held in high esteem for its remarkable curative powers.

A sodium sulphate water, as contrasted with the hard calcium sulphate water common to the Southwest, it is so soft that women shampoo their hair in it, and because no one mineral in it predominates, the water is both tasteless and odorless. Due to its purity, therapeutic values and softness, the water is widely used for drinking purposes in Phoenix, where it is delivered in 5-gallon bottles to homes and offices.

Baths at this friendly desert resort are given under supervision in a modern bath house with separate divisions for men and women, where the hot water pours into oversized tubs. Patients drink copiously of the mineralized water and upon leaving the tubs are wrapped in a sheet and blankets and allowed to perspire the impurities from their bodies.

The water and the baths are amazingly effective among people suffering from neuritis, rheumatism, stomach trouble, gout, asthma, arthritis, kidney trouble, nervousness, constipation, hyper-acidity, alcoholism and catarrh. A mildly laxative water with an alkaline reaction, it purges and tones up the system and is beneficial to persons subject to indigestion. The water and baths, coupled with the tranquility of the desert and the genial atmosphere which pervades the resort, are often spoken of by guests as a sure cure for a nervous, overworked, rundown condition. Special provisions have been made for sun bathing and guests are encouraged to spend long hours in the sunshine.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

Tonopah Hot Mineral Wells is operated on the American plan, but the dining room and baths are open to the public. The bath house is only a few steps from the main lodge. Modern furnished cottages are available by the week or month.

Climatic conditions permit outdoor activities almost every day and there is croquet, horseshoe pitching, ping pong, shuffleboard and other games.

Guests with communicable diseases or skin trouble cannot be accepted.

Tonopah has a postoffice and general store. Mail arrives three times a week. Telegraph address is Phoenix. Nearest railroad point, banking center and trading point is Buckeye.

## THE TONOPAH CLIMATE

Tonopah (Elevation 1120 feet) has an ideal winter climate. The days are warm and sunny, with the sun shining 80 percent of the possible time. An average of three-fourths of an inch of rain falls monthly during December, January, February and March. Temperatures rarely fall below freezing at night. Children play outdoors every day in the year at Tonopah.



## HOW TO REACH TONOPAH

When driving from Phoenix, take Highway 80 through Buckeye to junction with Salome road at Hassayampa. Follow Salome road 15 miles northwest. Turn north to Tonopah at sign. From Los Angeles, turn off Highway 60-70 at Salome and follow Phoenix road southeast 46 miles to Tonopah. From San Diego, turn off Highway 80 at Hassayampa. From Wickenburg, follow Vulture Mine road south to Tonopah. Guests coming to Hot Mineral Wells for a week's stay will be picked up free of charge by station wagon in Phoenix.

## PRIVATE LANDING FIELD

Tonopah Hot Mineral Wells has its own private landing field where guests arriving by plane can land and take off on a smooth, level strip a quarter-mile in length. Tonopah is on the direct Phoenix-Los Angeles air route.

## TRAILER COURT FOR GUESTS

A court is maintained at Tonopah Hot Mineral Wells for the accommodation of guests who desire to occupy their own house trailers. The court has electricity, water and toilets. A charge of a dollar a day is made for trailers. Meals at the lodge are optional. Baths are a dollar each.

## BOTTLED WATER FOR HOMES

Bottled water from the Tonopah Hot Mineral Wells is now available to homes and offices in Phoenix. Healthful, pure and soft, it makes an excellent drinking water. Delivered in 5-gallon jugs for \$1 a bottle.
